SANDRA RETURNS TO OTAY



FCC ACTION IN K6EOA CASE

Due to the intense interest in the Westlink News account of alleged jamming by K6EOA, SQUELCH TALES publishes the release in its entirety, transcribed from Westlink News with a production date of April 11, 1981.

"This week's top story centers on an FCC license revocation that may be a milestone case, because an administrative law judge has decided that mental incompetence is grounds for license denial, and the judge also said that when an individual applies for an amateur license, he or she must abide by Federal radio regulations and thus, as a licensee, give up certain first amendment rights. The case involves K6EOA, John W. Munson, Jr., of Los Angeles. On October 2, 1979, Munson was alleged to have transmitted an AO emission on 147.435 Mhz, jamming transmissions to the Mt. Wilson repeater. FCC engineers Lawrence Guy and James Joulek of the Long Beach office were nearby monitoring in a van with direction finding equipment. They recorded the transmissions, then knocked on Munson's door. They showed their identification and attempted to inspect his station, log and license. But Engineer Guy said in his official report later that they were not permitted entry and that Munson refused to show them his license or the records of his station. They returned to their monitoring vehicle and again started tape recorder. This time, they not only recorded more AO transmissions, but also threats on their lives if they attempted to inspect the amateur radio station again, and as Guy testified later, a threat to kill another amateur, too. As a result of the threats against the lives of the two Federal officers, Guy went to the U.S. Attorney in Los Angeles, and a complaint was issued, including a warrant to search the premises of Munson's home. Technically, a search warrant wasn't necessary because the engineers witnessed an infraction of Federal law. Under Part 97, an amateur who is observed violating the law with his radio transmissions must open his station log and license to inspection. Three days later, on October 5, Munson showed up at the FCC office in Long Beach and was arrested. Guy also served him with a search warrant and entered the ham shack of K6EOA. A stolen transceiver, a loaded rifle, marijuana plants portable transmitting equipment were seized. On March 19, 1980, a Federal Grand Jury returned an indictment against Munson for violation of Federal radio laws and for threatening the lives of FCC enforcement officers. But two months later, the indictments were dismissed when a court appointed psychiatrist found that Munson was legally insane, that lacked the mental capacity to discern the unlawful nature of his actions. In September, state charges were filed against Munson. In a four count criminal indictment, he was again accused of threatening bodily harm. In November, Munson entered a guilty plea to one of the state counts, and in January of this year, the judge ordered him to pay a \$500 fine, not to use his amateur equipment, and to undergo psychotherapy. He was also placed on three years probation. It sounds like that should be the end of the Munson case. But it's not. No, it isn't. The FCC reentered the act at that point and ordered a hearing on licensing before the chief administrative law judge, Lenore Ehrig, of Washington, D.C. Judge Ehrig held that since Munson was not mentally competent to discern right from wrong in his Federal

prosecution, he was not mentally competent to operate a lawful amateur radio station. Operating such a station would require adherence to the law. The judge also held that when one applies for a license under Part 97, one also implies consent to certain Federal regulations. One doesn't give up his right to free speech, but at the same time some lawyers would argue that a ham license doesn't entitle you to exercise your right of free speech on amateur radio. You can play music at home, in your car, or just about anywhere else you want, except on your amateur transmitter. We might be premature in calling these precedents landmark decisions, but the actions of the administrative law judge in this case affirmed the right of the FCC to make laws and to enforce them."

WESTLINK NEWS ON SANDRA REPEATERS

SANDRA has made arrangements for the popular Westlink News, and broadcasts (QST's) commenced on 19 April on the 146.04/64 Sunday night net and April 22 on the 147.75/15 Wednesday night net. The programs were enthusiastically received and will be continued with the possible omission occasionally on Sunday night. Why so? Westlink production days are on Friday or Saturday of each week. Final editing and preparation of the master tapes are targeted toward a 10:00 PM release time on Sunday, which is after the Otay net. However, to date, the tape has been avilable Sunday afternoon. Only on weks that this is the case will Otay carry the tape.

What is Westlink? Although this service has been around since it was founded by Jim Hendershot, WA6VQP, in 1976, many have had their first exposure through the SANDRA nets. One of the guys came up on Mt. Laguna the other night and asked, "What time will the Wesleyan: tape be on?" Westlink is a weekly news service, a spare time project, by hams and for hams. Producer is Bill Pasternak, WAGITF, service manager for a video service operation, who took over from Hendershot in June of 1979. Production coordinator is Bill Orenstein, KH6IAF, a broadcast engineer with the NBC radio news network, and the two voices you most often hear are Jim Davis, KA6IUH, program director for Los Angeles radio station KMPC, and Alan Kaul, W6RCL, who is with NBC TV network news. Also enlisted in the project are Bert Hicks, WB6MQV of Metromedia, and Lenore Jensen, W6NAZ, formerly with radio station KFWB in Los Angeles. A SANDRA member of the world-wide Westlink News Network is Mike Sullivan, WA6HJJ, who does such a professional job on our nets with the ARRL Bulletins. Mike is a reporter for Westlink. Westlink operates out of a studio in Hollywood, with professional equipment. Tape is made available via an automated telephone feed system.

An excellent tape/slide presentation on the making of Westlink hopefully will be available for our next membership meeting.



The classes must have done John some good. He passed his Advanced exam on April 29.


Footnote: Class will move to new location in July. Building currently used for classroom will be burned down July 1 by the El Cajon Fire Department in conjunction with firefighter training.



BOARD MEETING MINUTES MAY 7, 1981

Board members present: WA6JTB, WA6KHA, WA6BSD, WA6CDK, WA6AIL, N6LY. Guests present: W6PDA, WA6YVX, W6GIC, dw6UZL, K6BWT, WA6OYI, WA6BDW.

The membership chairman, WAGKHA, reported we are still getting new members and renewals at a good rate.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$1484.21 in our checking account. See a complete report elsewhere in this issue.

Meeting Chairman: The president accepted the resignation of WB6RIR as meeting chairman.

W6UZL reported on the Westlink tapes, and reported favorable comments on the service of playing them on the nets.

WA60YI offered the services of his brother's print shop to help print SQUELCH TALES. He also has some ads for the publication.

WA6YVX, trustee of Otay, outlined plans to switch the machines and return SANDRA to Mt. Otay by the time this issue comes out.

WA6KHA will be the call of the new repeater on Lyons and Vance will be the trustee. Vance reported that N6BSD has fixed the autopatch power supply and it is back in use now.

N6BSD told of a need of tubes for the machines. He made a motion to purchase 4 sets of tubes for two repeaters with 3 tubes per set. The motion was seconded by WA6AIL and passed. It will cost about \$200.

Otay Site: The building is done and ready for occupancy, except for some little jobs.

Otay Site Rental Plan: The committee is looking at lease agreements and deciding what parts are needed for our purposes.

Misuse of Otay: N6BSD reported that the continuous day in, day out use by three or four members is upsetting many members who aren't able to use the machine. Members are calling in and complaining about it. The Board discussed the problem and came up with the following comments:

1. Set the timer at 60 seconds.

2. Appoint a sheriff.

3. Explain again in SQUELCH TALES that repeaters are channelized and should NOT be used for continuous ragchewing. 04/64 should be used as a calling frequency to contact someone to take them to simplex or to a repeater that does not have 800 members who may wish to contact someone themselves. The Lyon's Peak repeater can be used for longer QSO's, and it was suggested that people suggest that long QSO's should be carried on only on simplex or on the Lyon's Peak repeater.

N6BSD reported on autopatch interference with WR6ABQ. By the next TASMA meeting, the person in charge of that machine will report what

has been done about the problem. The next meeting is May 15, and N6BSD can't attend. WA6EYX will probably attend for SANDRA.

It was suggested that SANDRA should put up a sign on Highway 5 and 8 coming into town with the 04/64 frequency on it big enough for visitors to see when coming into town. The Chamber of Commerce is the agency to contact.

Taped messages were also proposed by WA60YI.

K6BWT announced the ARRL Convention in Fresno.

The meeting adjourned at 8:38 PM.



SHUTTLE TALK

Bob Gonsett, WA 6QQQ, reports receiving direct voice signals from Orbit #1 of Space Shuttle Columbia by using simple ham radio equipment. Minutes before local sunrise on April 12, 1981 - as TV stations showed the shuttle approaching the Pacific Coast of North America - Bob detected the first doppler shifted AM modulated signals. The shuttle's transmitter was turned on only when the astronauts were talking and stayed in range for only a few minutes.

The system pictured here, built around a Mini-Circuits Laboratory Type ZAD mixer (about \$30), was all that was required. Note the 220 MHz ground plane antenna which provided surprisingly strong signals even though it wasn't cut for frequency. You might try a similar receiving set up next time the shuttle comes around. After all, S.S. Columbia is rare DX.

TWENTY SIXTH ANNUAL WEST COAST UHF CONFERENCE

This year the 26th Annual VHF "Gettogether" was held at the HILTON in Sunnyvale with some 150 attending. Project OSCAR Inc., sponsored the Event. Project Oscar is 20 years old this year. The Coordinator was H. Paul Shuch, N6TX (WA6UAM), well known Contributor to Amateur Microwave Communications, Chief Engineer of MICROCOM Company and a Project Engineer with the Oscar program.

Each year, traditionally in May, many of the dedicated VHF, UHF and Microwave oriented Hams, residing along the West Coast, gather at a prearranged place for the primary purpose of evaluating "Homegrown" Antennas. It started almost 30 years ago in the San Francisco Bay area when a few, serious VHF Antenna builders arranged a meeting, on a Sunday to compare their designs. It became a contest when hey began the measurements, and it was called The West Coast VHF Antenna Contest. In those days People attended by invitation. It grew with time and the addition of other Activities, Noise figure measurements, Talks, prize drawings, an occasioal "Flea Market" until now it is a full 2 day Affair and the name has been appropriately changed to "Conference".

There were 12 very interesting Technical Talks given at the Conference, on Saturday morning, 4 Saturday afternoon and 5 in the Evening to coincide with the Noise measurements, for the benefit of those not participating in the Noise Figure activity. These Talks were presented by people who are Experts in this field and covered all facets of Amateur UHF and Microwave Communications.

The drawings for prizes took place at 5 PM, there were some 160 prizes more prizes than People registered. The way it was arranged, every registered Person received a prize. The prizes, for the most part, were Transistors, Components, Antennas and Test Equipment. These were donated by Manufacturer/Distributors concerned with VHF Hardware. The Books and Subscriptions were the donations of Publishing Houses and the League.

The Receiving Equipment noise figure measurements were started at 8 PM as usual. Most of the Devices were either Down Converters or Pre-Amps. The measuring started at 432 MHz. and went through "X Band" (10 GHz.). The lowest noise figure observed was that of a Gas-Fet Pre-Amp at 432 MHz., the reading was .5 (1/2) decibel. An interesting experiment or demonstration was performed during the 432 measurements by Lou Anciaux, WB6NMT. Dry ice was put inside a Gas-Fet 432 Pre-Amp, as the Device cooled down the noise figure was lowered to a point where an accurate measurement was difficult.

The Antenna measurements took place on Sunday Morning as always, in an open field, at the east end of the Hotel Comples. The modulated "source" was put on a Vehicle some 100 yards into the clear field. The measurements were made from the edge of the parking area where the paved surface provided solid ground for measurement activity. Some 30 Contestants measured their 40 odd Antennas, ranging from 432 MHz. Beams to the "X Band" "Dishes".

Participants from the San Diego Area were Louis Anciaux, WB6NMT, Mike Horgan, WB6RIR, Dan Peterson, WA60IL and Red Truax, W6BLK.

Next year the VHF/UHF Conference will be held here in San Diego.

IF YOU THINK YOU HAVE TVI PROBLEMS

Gugliemo Marconi needed police protection from people who threatened to kill him because they thought his radio waves were harmful to life. The frightened people complained that the radio signals were passing through their bodies and making it impossible for them to sleep. A wealthy woman charged that the waves made her feet itch. A German man publicly made plans to go to England and shoot Mr. Marconi, but was turned away by British authorities.

The hostility toward the inventor came after years of being ignored by the public. In 1894, the 20 year old electronic pioneer coaxed his crude equipment to send a signal a few feet across his room. Next year his signals spanned the length of his father's home in Bologna, Italy. When Marconi patriotically offered his invention to the Minister of Post and Telegraphs, he was snubbed.

Marconi packed up his equipment, and with his Irish mother, sailed to England. Surely, he thought, the world's greatest maritime power could use ship-to-shore communications. British customs officials ignored his frantic efforts to explain that his radio was not an explosive device or bomb. The delicate instrument was damaged by their forcing it open. The following year a family friend helped him gain the attention of the British Postal Authority, and he gave a demonstration that he could send a signal from the General Post Office to a nearby building. The press and the public showed no interest in the feat at all.

Marconi then constructed a bamboo tower that thrust his transmitter 90 feet in the air and sent his wireless signals nearly two miles. He had built something too big to be ignored this time, and the press took notice. Years later, he sadly observed, "The calm life is over."

The publicity aroused fears in a previously indifferent public about the possible harmful effects of radio waves. A flood of crank mail, some containing threats on his life, came pouring in. Guarded by the police, Marconi moved his operation to Wales in 1897. Soon he spanned the Atlantic Ocean with his wireless signals. It was more than two years after this that the public outcry diminished enough for Scotland Yard to withdraw the police guards protecting the man who many claimed was insane. Today we remember the man who developed radio for the world.

JOHN DOE'S REPLY TO DOCKET 80-729

Federal Communications Commission Washington, D.C. 20554

Re Docket 80-729

Gentlemen:

I have been a licensed Amateur Radio operator for years, and currently hold an Amateur Class license. As a -year member of the Amateur Radio Emergency Service, I participate regularly in public service events and, over the past years, have provided communications during emergencies such as fires, floods, and earthquakes.

After reading Docket 80-729, and discussing it with many of my Amateur Radio friends, and at club meetings, I STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT THE COMMISSION DISAPPROVE THE ENTIRE DOCKET, for the following reasons:

- The present rules are perfectly understandable. The premise that "the existing rules are unnecessarily complex and difficult to understand" is fallacious.
- The real justification seem to be "we issued a 'plain language' revision of the CB rules, which was met with widespread acclaim."
- 3. The elimination of the present Basis and Purpose (97.1) and substituting an unrelated definition completely deletes the role of amateur radio in service to the public and subverts the role of amateur radio as we have known it for many years. No longer would it serve the public interest, convenience or necessity.
- 4. The proposed rules deviate so extensively from the present ones that to comment on the substance would, in effect, require a complete re-write of the proposal. Since it took the Commission's staff 18 months to draft the proposal, a re-write by the users of the Amateur Radio Service obviously would be infeasible.
- 5. The language of the proposal belittles the intelligence of Amateur Radio operators who, obviously, have been capable of understanding the present language since they did pass the Commission's tests and obtain their licenses even as young as 5 years of age.
- There are many of the proposed rules which are less simple and understandable than in the present rules.

PROPOSED BILL

Senator Barry Goldwater, K7UGA, and the members of the Communications Subcommittee have introduced S-929, the Amateur Radio Service and Private Land Mobile and Fixed Services Act of 1981. For clarification, the following is a Fact Sheet on that PROPOSED Bill. All Amateurs who agree with the provisions herein should write the two California Senators, urging support for the Bill. Since it may be necessary to petition the Bill out of committee, early recognition by Senators that their constituents support the bill may become very important. Pass the word to other Amateurs.

Please, then, if possible immediately register your interest in the bill 1) with the Subcommittee and 2) with your two Senators, and 3) pass the word along to other Amateurs who can also write.

FACT SHEET

AMATEUR RADIO AND PRIVATE LAND MOBILE AND FIXED SERVICES ACT OF 1981

- 1. The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) is granted the authority to establish minimum radio frequency rejection standards for electronic equipment, including television receivers, to make such equipment less susceptible to interference from other electronic equipment such as CB radio, amateur radio, etc.
- The radio-frequency rejection standards will not apply to electronic equipment manufactured prior to the enactment of the bill.
- The FCC is granted the power to regulate or prohibit the delivery of radio frequency transmitting equipment to one not possessing a license to operate that equipment.
- 4. Amateur radio transmissions are exempt from the secrecy provisions of Section 605 of the Communications Act to allow self-regulation of amateur stations.
- 5. Amateur radio license terms are increased from 5 to 10 years.
- 6. The FCC is permitted to utilize volunteer licensed amateur radio operators for the purpose of monitoring unlicensed amateur radio stations, or amateur stations operating in violation of the rules.
- 7. The FCC is permitted to utilize volunteer licensed citizen band radio service operators for the purpose of monitoring unlicensed citizen band radio stations, or citizen band radio stations operating in violation of the rules.
- 8. Allow the FCC to utilize volunteer licensed amateur radio operators for the purpose of preparing and administering amateur examinations to applicants for entry-level amateur licenses, provided that the volunteer test administrator possesses a higher class of amateur license than the entry-level class of license.

- Private land mobile and fixed services license terms are increased from 5 to 10 years.
- 10. In managing the spectrum to be made available for use by the private land mobile and fixed services, the FCC shall consider whether such use promotes safety, service, competition, and interservice sharing; and reduces the regulatory burden on spectrum users.
- 11. The FCC may delegate to non-Federal Government coordinating committees the frequency coordination function for frequencies above 30 megahertz to stations in the private land mobile and fixed services.

SANDRA OPERATES TWO NETS:

Sunday Evening at 8:00 p.m. on 04/64 Wednesday Eve. at 7:30 p.m. on 75/15

SANDRA, Inc. operates the following repeaters for service to the San Diego area and environs. The policy of the organization is that the repeaters are available for all licensed Amateurs to use, so long as applicable rules and regulations are observed, whether members of SANDRA, Inc. or not. Further, the following priorities must be observed: (1) Emergency traffic, concerning the safety of life or property take priority over all other traffic. Failure to yield to any station indicating the need for such traffic is prohibited, and may render the offender subject to legal action. Indication of the need for such traffic may be "Break Emergency," "Break-Break," or any other clearly indicated statement. (2) Call-ups should be permitted. If an operator "breaks" into a conversation, he should be permitted to make such a callup. He should not, however, "take over" the repeater and exclude those who were already using it. (3) "Rag-chewing" is not prohibited, but care must be exercised to assure that the repeater is not tied up for extended periods. Remember, there are almost 400 members, and several hundred non-members, who have as much right to use the facilities as you do. It is extremely discourteous to monopolize them to the exclusion of these other users. Long QSO's should be limited to simplex frequencies or the lower bands
